



HEALTH AND SAFETY INFORMATION

TERMINAL REGULATIONS

- ✓ All visitors have to report at Gate 1 before entering the premises (not for vessels arriving in the port).
- ✓ Upon arrival at Gate 1, visitors have to report their name, licence plate of their vehicle (if applicable) the company they are working for, which company or vessel they will be visiting, who their contact at the respective company or vessel is and what the purpose and intended duration of their visit is.
- ✓ All visitors are obliged to wear all personal protection equipment as indicated in this manual.
- ✓ No work or activities can be started without the permission of Wagenborg Stevedoring.
- ✓ All incidents, or near incidents, have to be reported to Wagenborg Stevedoring.
- ✓ Only appropriately certified operators are allowed to operate plant, machinery or equipment.

The maximum speed limit for all vehicles is 15 kilometres per hour.
Normal Dutch road regulations apply at the terminal.

Smoking is only allowed in outside areas.

SAFETY HAZARDS

Work is continuously carried out at this terminal!



There are cranes working at this terminal. Make sure never to stand under a load.



There are forklifts working at this terminal. Take care of moving plant.

PERSONAL PROTECTION EQUIPMENT

Personal protection equipment to be worn at all times:



Safety helmets must be worn at all times.



Protective footwear must be worn at all times.



A high visibility jacket must be worn at all times.

When working with a grinder, when welding or in any other case with risk of eye injuries:



The appropriate protective eyewear must be worn.

When working in a noisy environment:



The appropriate hearing protection must be worn.

When working on pontoons :



A life jacket must be worn.

When working at heights (2.5 metres or more above ground level):



Fall protection must be worn.

LAST MINUTE RISK ASSESMENT

1. What are you going to do?

- Are the tasks clear?
- Is a work instruction/work permit present and is it clear?

2. What are the hazards?

- Fall hazard, electrocution, jamming hazard, weather conditions, physical strain, falling objects/ tools, (environmental) hazardous materials, high pressure, ...

3. Can you do the job safely?

- Is the work environment secure?
- Are there other activities nearby?
- Do you have the right PPE, tools and support/communication equipment?

4. If not, take action

- Alert your colleagues/supervisor/other people involved and if possible solve the problem together.

IN CASE OF EMERGENCY

What to do when you are (in)directly involved in an emergency:

1. Contact the European Emergency Number 112

Inform the people there of your name, your location, what happened and how many people are possibly injured, including the nature of the injuries. Direct the emergency services to the nearest gate.

2. Inform Wagenborg Stevedoring Terminal Eemshaven operator

You can also call Wagenborg Agencies (24/7) on +31 596 636 254 for assistance.

3. Send someone to the nearest gate to guide the emergency services to the incident

4. If safely and reasonably possible, take away the hazard to prevent additional injuries

5. If safely and reasonably possible, and only if you have the relevant knowledge, try to administer first aid.
